FEMA AWARDS DELHI TOWNSHIP A \$994,550 PRE-DISASTER MITIGATION GRANT

The Public Works Department has been working for several years with the Metropolitan Sewer District in an effort to obtain funds from FEMA to help move residents from harm's way on Rapid Run Road. Homes along Rapid Run Road, between Neeb Road and Anderson Ferry, have been prone to repetitive flooding and the residents have suffered incredible financial losses associated with these events. The fruits of these labors are finally beginning to be seen.
