Delhi Township Increasing Recycling Efforts

Delhi Township is further increasing its recycling efforts by placing two recycling containers in the south parking lot of Delhi Park directly behind McDonald's. These two recycling containers are in addition to the four that are currently located in the Senior Citizens Center parking lot on Neeb Road and bring to six the total number of containers located within the Township.

These new containers are the latest in an ongoing effort by Delhi Township to increase its recycling program. The Township's increased efforts last year were recognized as Delhi received the 2006 Care Award for Most Improved Recycling Program from the Hamilton County Solid Waste Management District.

Items accepted for recycling include: Newspaper, Junk Mail, Magazines, Catalogues, Box Board, White & Colored Paper, Computer Paper, Brown Paper Bags, Cardboard Boxes (excluding pizza boxes), Steel Food Cans, Aluminum Cans, Glass Bottles and Jars. Plastic #1 and #2, as identified by the number appearing within the recycle triangle on the bottom of the container, will also be accepted. These include two liter soda bottles (without lids), cooking oil bottles, peanut butter jars, milk jugs, etc. Residents are **not** required to separate items before placing them into the recycling container.

Recycling not only allows Delhi residents to help save natural resources, conserve energy and save landfill space it also provides funds for the Township. The amount of recycling funds that Delhi Township receives depends upon the volume of material that the community recycles and the amount of recycling education, awareness and promotion the Township performs. Funds obtained from Delhi's recycling efforts are used to purchase recycled products as well as to pay for special recycling events such as the annual Clean-Up Delhi Day which is scheduled for April 28th this year
